

The Old Martin County Courthouse is one of the 27 oldest courthouses in N.C. and one of a dozen built between 1860 and 1900. It blends Italianate, Medieval and late Victorian architectural elements. Restoration of the first floor is complete.

## Historic Williamston & Martin County

Williamston is the oldest Roanoke River port in Martin County. It was called Tar Landing in the early 1700's and later incorporated as Williamston in 1774. The port was a center for the export of timber, tar and turpentine. Martin County Tourism Office & Visitor It was the commercial hub for vast farming enterprises that continue to the present day.
